



"NEWS FROM OUR CHURCHES"

Jesus said, "Let the children come to me." Matthew 19:14 That's what camp is all about - for children to know Jesus loves them and to make Him part of their everyday life.


We had a great camp this year. The campers learned that Jesus is real and hope He can be real in their daily walk.
