



### Florence Oregon

Looking to attend a different car show, four WVSR members and one OFC member left Salem to attend the Rods 'N Rhode's Invitational (entries had to be previously approved) Car Show in Florence, Oregon, September 5-6 & 7th, 2014. This is a 3-day event with an all-day car show on Bay Street in Old Town Florence.

Attending were Ray and Linda Agen-'36 Ford; Jim and Kathy Schuette-'58 Buick; Warren and Judy Horne-'25 T Bucket (but for unforeseen circumstances, drove their '54 Chev Suburban instead); John and Sharon Palmer-'52 Chevy; and Bob and Lisa Carney-'70 Chevy short box PU. We all left the K-Mart parking lot at 9:30AM and headed toward Florence.









