Blessed is the one against whom God will not calculate, or determine or value their sins.

Illustration: Trash.

The one <u>dedicated to God</u> was the one to kill.

The one <u>dedicated to Azazel</u>.

Now we want to see how Jesus Christ has forgiven our sins:

Hebrews 9:7, Hebrews 9:25-27, Hebrews 10:11,12

So, what does it mean to be forgiven?

"Blessed is the one whose sins have been picked up and carried away,

Blessed is the one whose sins have been covered up and the don't show anymore, and

Blessed is the one against whom God will not <u>calculate</u>, or <u>determine</u> or <u>value</u> their sins."

- 3. Three words that describe OUR RESPONSE to being forgiven: Psalm 32:11
  - **A. Rejoice:** "to celebrate with wild unrestrained passion"
  - B. Be glad: "to shout!"
  - C. Sing: inexplicable joy.

"God through Jesus Christ who has offered himself as a sacrifice once and for all, picks up my sin, my trash and carries it away, covers it up and says, "I will never bring it up again!"

How – can - I - do - anything less than celebrate with unrestrained passion to shout and to sing with inexpressible joy?
