
## 2013 Newsletter and 2014 Look Ahead



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Dear all,

A very belated happy new year to you all.

My apologies that this update is later than planned but I am pleased to say that 2013 was another busy and successful year for AZLera and Project Ocean in Mozambique.

AZLera's University Scholarship Programme completes its pilot year with students Firoza and Mingos making great strides on their respective Architecture and Medicine Courses, proving the real potential we saw in them through their years at Projecto Oceano

We recently completed the first full year of our <u>University</u> <u>Scholarship Programme at AZLera</u>. As expected, the programme represented an enormous challenge for us as an organisation, but I am pleased to say that we have come out the other side far better off. We have stronger connections with the leading institutions in Mozambique. We understand the higher education system much better and most importantly of all, we have proved that Projecto Oceano's top candidates have what it takes to compete alongside other, often more privileged, Mozambican students.

Our successful duo from the 2012 selection process, <u>Mingos</u> and Firoza, began their respective courses in Architecture and Medicine back in March 2013. One year on, the students have performed excellently, although challenges abound for them and for us as it is a huge experiment in mentoring, logistics and performance; they are now preparing for year 2. Over the coming week, we will be posting some photos and reports on our website detailing the experiences from their first year at University, for those who are interested.

The experience to date of the programme has incentivised us to continue. We believe these young adults going to University is an integral part of our programme once they complete high school and are ready for the "next" stage in their development. In order to make sure that we at AZLera are ready for them and for the next generation of students, this year we will professionalise our fundraising and are in active talks with individuals to do that. The Ambassador and his wife also participated in a Q&A session with the students. The day was a great success for all involved with the project gaining great exposure and warm words of praise from the Ambassador. Naiza : Recipient of AZLera University Scholarship Fund 2013

After two long weeks of assessment, including formal interviews and written examinations, the final decision was announced in the second week of January that Naiza Germano Langa had been awarded the 2013 AZLera University Scholarship. Naiza is a an intelligent young woman and a leading participant in our programme; she has been a core project member for the last 3 years and received glowing references from our project managers in Mozambique as well as her school teachers.

Naiza led a number of classes and activities at Projecto Oceano, as well as being responsible for the research and writing of our monthly community newsletter – <u>Voz Jovem</u>.

Naiza has decided to study Medicine and is in the process of finalising her applications to either study at UCM in Beira or ISCTEM in Maputo – both excellent Universities that will undoubtedly set up Naiza well for a successful career.

Exciting and ambitious plans afoot for 2014 including new academic modules taught by qualified professionals, the continued development of AZLera's education model and a real push to raise funds to sustain our work in Mozambique

There is much to be proud of from our successes in 2013, but also an even greater realisation of the enormous opportunities that lie ahead of us over the coming year. In particular there is a pressing need internally to do more. We want to expand our reach and we want to increasingly contribute to our community in Mozambique. Having just completed our revised project plan and budget, 2014 promises to be an even more exciting year for the organisation:

- Following the success of the creative modules in 2013, we will continue with <u>new focused modules (Economics /</u> <u>Business Skills / IT Programming)</u> being taught at the project, facilitated by international qualified professionals who have agreed to commit their time to the programme, in return for the pleasure of being on Ilha de Moçambique (!);
- AZLera has committed to adding to our management base, with two new roles. We are currently looking to fill the positions of: <u>AZLera Programme Officer</u> and <u>Fundraising Lead</u>. - Fundraising will be central theme of our work in 2014, as we look to diversify our funding base and make the organisation more sustainable. 
