Although the members we were able to continue with some of our classes, our activities were slightly disrupted during this time.

Carolina has worked in investment banking both in Brazil and abroad and is a great addition to the team. She will be giving business and economics classes at the project and will work with our members to look into local fundraising opportunities to help take our project forward and become more self-sufficient. She will also be looking at international scholarships and other opportunities available to our members once they complete high school.

This month we also organized a debate on "rites of passage to adulthood" in the Northern Region of

Mozambique. This is a fairly controversial topic and we heard many interesting opinions on the subject. We have finalised the selection process for our new members. We will have four new members, Agiria, Egidia, Sergio and Zibia who will be starting at the project shortly. They will be on a trial period this month during which they will receive training and start getting involved in the different activities on offer at Projecto Oceano. We look forward to start working with these talented youth and help them achieve academic success.
