Jessica Care Moore is an internationally renowned poet/ publisher/ activist/ rock star/ playwright and actor. She is a five-time Showtime at the Apollo winner; has featured on hip-hop mega-star, "Nastradamus" album and was a returning star of Russell Simmon's HBO Series, Def Poetry Jam.

After her legendary win on the Apollo stage, jessica Care moore was approached by several book publishing companies, but in 1997, she paved her own path and launched a publishing company of her own Moore Black Press. Which has released her first book; "The Words Don't Fit In My Mouth," and several thousand copies. A few years later, she followed up with her second collection of poetry and essays, "The Alphabet Verses The Ghetto." This bold and electric artist has shared the stage with the late Ossie Davis, CeCe Winans, Gregory Hines, Anthony David, Norah Jones, Amiri Baraka, Patti Labelle, Roy Ayers, Mos Def, The Last Poets, Sonia Sanchez, Talib Kweli, Nikki Giovanni,

Steve Harvey, Maya Angelou and many others. In 1999, she was honored as Woman of the Year by the Harvard Black Men's Forum. .

Her innovative and inspiring take on literacy among our nation's youth landed her opportunities to produce several art programs, concerts, and workshops for the National Black Arts Festival in Atlanta, and worked as a facilitator for The Langston **Hughes National Poetry Cir**cle Project.

That was my mom, Regina Mae Bates Wilson.

This month we celebrate Woman's History Month and my family personally celebrates our mom making her transition to be with her heavenly father. Our mom was the type of mother that expected the best of her children and her children's friends. We had a strict rule, homework first.

Although we were all active in sports and she left that part of our lives to our father, Robert Wilson, she made sure our academics was done. We had a combined TV life of the Leave it to Beaver and the Cosby Show. Our wonderful mom was a Stay at Home mom through most of our lives. My dad worked and provided for our family so mom could focus on us. She cooked breakfast each morning, had lunch for us (we came home for lunch each day) and dinner for us when we got home from school activities. She was active in PTA. community events and political groups. We went to Circle Y church camp each summer, girl scouts outings and events

with the Beechwood Community Center groups.

At our house, education was primary. My mom eventually graduated with an Associate's Degree and spread her magic with the Head Start program in River Rouge. She served on the River Rouge School Board for years and the City of River Rouge named a street by the school Regina Wilson Blvd. Me along with my brother and sisters went to a Historically Black College. (Derek - Lane College; Ingrid - Spelman and me and Angela - Tuskegee University) When asked by one of my co-workers at my first job after college, "When did you decide you wanted to go to college?" I replied, "I never knew there was another option. We talked about college always." As I thought about that answer later, I realized that during our Sunday dinners at our grandparents house (The Farm) on Martinsville Rd in New Boston, the talk was college... All of our first cousins also went college also.

There comes a time when you realize that your mom is a special person. She died 16 years ago this month and I still run into people that say she positively impacted their lives. I miss my mother a lot, but the memories that we have and the values that her and my dad instilled in us has helped us raise our children to be respectable young adults.

Dingell Statement on Trump's New Executive Order Banning Muslims and Refugees from Entering the US

DEARBORN, MI – U.S. Congresswoman Debbie Dingell (MI-12) released the following statement on President Trump's new executive order seeking to reinstate his ban preventing Muslims and refugees from entering the United States.

"Today's executive order is simply an attempt to repackage the administration's harmful and unconstitutional ban on Muslims and refugees. While the administration tried to tweak the glaring problems in the initial ban that led to chaos at airports and unlawful detentions around the country, the fact remains: this is the same ban that targets individuals based on their region and flies in the face of our Constitution and our values as a nation.

"Daily, I hear stories from constituents scared to death about what will happen next. Families who have been part of our communities for decades and are second and third generation Americans are terrified that someone will knock on their

door in the middle of the night and force them from this country. Last week, I met with students from the University of Michigan who came to the United States wanting nothing but the best — to receive a world-class education and contribute their knowledge and skills to our economy. Now, they question whether this country even wants them here. This is not who we are.

"National security experts, faith leaders, academia and the business community all agree that this ban endangers our national security and dishonors our Constitution and everything our nation stands for. This is not the America I was raised to believe in."

Ben Carson Sworn-in as Trump's **Only Black Cabinet Pick**

The swearing-in of all of the primary members of President Donald Trump's cabinet is just about complete. Most of Trump's cabinet from Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin to Commerce Secretary Wilbur Ross—are rich, White and male.

On Thursday, March 2, retired neurosurgeon Dr. Ben Carson broke the mold with his swearing-in as Housing and Urban Development secretary, officially becoming the only African-American in Trump's cabinet.

The former GOP presidential candidate was confirmed by a 58-41 vote, leaving just four of Trump's 22 cabinet-level nominees still unsworn.

"Right now, our country is the patient and it's not a Democrat or a Republican patient..It's an American patient," Carson said at his swearing-in as his wife, Lacena and granddaughter Tesora held the Bible. "We have a duty to use the gifts that God has given all of us in order to heal that patient." Carson, 65, was born into

family, but ultimately became a popular neurosurgeon who ran for president last year winning the

In January, he vowed to begin his job at HUD by going on a listening tour before developing any longplans for the department, which has more than 8,000 employees and a \$50 billion budget.

In February, during Black History Month, Carson joined Trump for a tour of the Smithsonian National Museum of African American History and Culture where the president said Carson would work very closely with him.

"HUD has a meaning far beyond housing," Trump said. "If properly done, it's a meaning that's as big as anything there is."

Carson, whose mother at times received food stamps to provide for her family, grew up surrounded by some of the housing assistance programs he will now oversee.

"The New York Times" reported that, rather than embrace the programs that an impoverished Detroit once sustained his family

and the families around him, Carson adopted standard Republican beliefs that too much government helpboth in desegregating neighborhoods and in lifting people from poverty—can discourage people from working hard.

Carson was awarded a scholarship to Yale University, and at 33, he was named director of pediatric neurosurgery at Johns Hopkins Children's Center. He later became an author and a philanthropist supporting scholarships for young, often impoverished students.

"Housing discrimination continues to be a significant problem in this country, unfairly limiting people's choices about where to live," Lisa Rice, executive vice president of the National Fair Housing Alliance, said in a statement. "We look to Secretary Carson to marshal the resources of the department he leads to combat this problem, and to fight all forms of housing discrimination."

State Rep. Adam Fredrick Zemke speaks from the millennial generation



This week, in Getting to Know our Elected Officials, I sat down with State Representative Adam Fredrick Zemke. He is a millennial generation member of the Michigan House of Representatives. He represents the 55th District which include the city of Ann Arbor and Washtenaw County and he has great ideas on how to make these communities better.

1. What do you see as a few of the biggest problems facing the residents of the Ann Arbor community?

A: There are not many different issues technically speaking for the Ann Arbor District. But, I Can say I have seen a huge increase when it comes to wages. Especially in educational backgrounds we see young people coming out of college without a lot debt. Also, make sure we get business coming in and out of state the proper training. When it comes to tax money we all should be paying a fair budget. We should be spending on the things that will help impact people's lives. But, legislation raised voting registration fees and gas tax by 20%. I voted against it. But I definitely want to see tax relief and a Specific road Plan to fix the roads.

2. What organizations are you involved in?

A: I work on Educational things outside of the legislator but I represent House of Representatives. The boards I help serve on is the citing of general motors engineers foundation and educational foundation.

3. What exactly influenced you to join the political arena

vs working with the private sector in engineering?

A: I got involved because I worked with kids who had fewer resources than I did growing up as a child. My family was huge on education, treating others with respect, and being impactful. So within the educational foundation I found a problem with equity. I wanted to express to kids that there is always opportunities. No matter the race, color, or religion.

4. Who are your biggest sup-

A: The community members of Washtenaw County along with family support, they loved cam-

5. Has legislation done anything with House Bill 5968 (protect victims of abuse, eviction, and fines?

A: Not as of right now, we spoke on it last session but we have to reintroduce it. I am a huge supporter of that. We are still in the process.

Do you think you and other house democrats will help push legislation for the **DPS Schools?**

A: Absolutely, I know I am supportive of it. There are problems that need to be fixed by the state. As I mentioned before with the educational system, transportation, and training with teachers. Sometimes it can be very difficult to increase funding because of the partisan environment., but you can count on the house of democrats to be there.

7. What is your idea on fixing the roads?

A: I definitely see a funding issue. We need to make the heavy vehicles pay for their damage. And that's the main problem; we aren't charging for their damage. We need to make it fair. The house of democrats has a plan for it.


