<u>Bethlehem's Choir</u> – resumes on November 5th. Come help us celebrate the Advent Season! Everyone is very welcome.




BETHLEHEM LADIES AID:

Special Council Meeting Minutes

October 12, 2017

Call to Order & Roll Call: 7:00 p.m. There were 12 members present: Marv Sperber, Dennis Anderson, Karon Davidson, Steve Davidson, Dorothy Luedtke, Darleen Noel, Eugene Neumann, Pastor Norton, Sharon Tumm, Sally Weggen, Tom Woodford, Joan Drehmel.

Pastor Norton began the meeting with a prayer.

Marv Sperber explained that the Remodel Committee had 2 proposals to bring to the Council, and would then present to the congregation at a Special Voters Meeting on Sunday, October 29th.

The committee has been working with Wayne Hanson, a contractor from Eau Claire who has experience with church remodeling jobs. The original plan to remodel the narthex would not address the problem of bringing the restrooms up to code.

Option #1: remodel narthex and restroom addition would cost \$95,000-100,000

Option #2: remodel narthex, restroom addition, and carport would cost \$131,000

The carport was designed to be a stand-alone project that could be added at a later date. The prices are an estimate, as the committee will be working with the contractor to iron out possible cost saving measures. Either option would require a test for asbestos of the ceiling tiles. The test would cost \$1,000 – the abatement could cost up to \$10,000. Marv, Eugene, and Dale Noel are working on securing financing through several banks and the Lutheran Church Extension Fund. Marv will have a definite answer on the loan before the Special Voters Meeting to know if the project is a go. He will inform the congregation on Sunday, October 15th about the options, post a copy of the plans on the divider, and remind everyone to attend the meeting after church on Sunday, October 29th.

• **MOTION** (Dennis Anderson/Steve Davidson) to present the options to the congregation at a Special Voters Meeting on Sunday, October 29th, following church services. PASSED, without negative vote.



Other than that, not much has been going on. I hope all is going well with you!


