This section is for you! Here we share details on something coming up this month. This year's Veterans Day Assembly will take place on Tuesday, November 15th at 9am. It is a beautiful, moving event that families are welcome to attend and you won't want to miss! The school sent out a flyer with information on how to RSVP to bring a family member or friend who is a veteran or still actively serving, so they can be a part of the "Salute to Veterans." Even if you don't have a veteran guest to bring, consider attending this heartwarming assembly that includes guest speakers and songs performed by GHS's youngest students.

VOLUNTEER SPOTLIGHT - This month, we shine our volunteer spotlight on "the playground guy" who wants to do his share - Playground Committee Chair Scott Guzzo.

Scott, a sales manager for a fire protection company, moved back to Green Township two years ago with his wife Lisa, son Ty who is now in 4th grade, and daughter Bella who is now in 2nd grade. He attended his first back-to-school night as a GHS dad in 2014 and was immediately drawn to the Playground Project. He recalls talking with Membership Co-Chair April Orozco at the PTA table that night. "April asked me if there were any committees I would be interested in and Playground caught my

eye. I was excited to be back in Green Township with such a wonderful community and a great school for my kids. The existing playground at GHS was the only thing that I was disappointed in. It doesn't match the quality of the school overall." As he got involved in the Playground Project, Scott learned how much the PTA does for the school. "Until two years ago, I never really thought about what a PTA does for a community. I assumed that everything at school was supplied by taxpayers through the school's budget. I quickly realized how much the PTA gives back to the community through projects, supplies, and fundraisers. I want to do my share."

Scott, who has been involved with the Playground Committee since its inception, is looking forward to two events this month - a fun fundraiser and a competition. On November 15th, there will be a Skyzone/Panera playground fundraiser, where he will be jumping and having fun. He encourages everyone to come out and jump with Mr. Nittolo and some favorite teachers. Also, he's excited about the Playground Committee brick competition, which will conclude on November 18th. Buying and selling bricks, Scott explains, are great opportunities for kids, families, teachers and anyone in the community to be a part of the playground and to help raise funds for the project.

The PTA Playground Committee has raised over \$70,000, and they plan to continue fundraising through Thanksgiving. "Raising funds has been challenging. But, the community involvement and enthusiasm at the events we've held for the playground have been outstanding, and we're very grateful for the individuals, families, and businesses who are supporting us. We're in the homestretch, and we'll take the money we raise by Thanksgiving and build the best playground we can in the spring." When asked what he enjoys most about his involvement with the Playground Project, Scott says "It is kind of cool that when I walk down the halls at school, all the kids call me 'the playground guy'."

When he isn't working or volunteering with the PTA, he makes time for long distance running and triathlons. And, you can often catch him at his kids' sporting events as a spectator, coach, or announcing the football games - occasionally sporting a "PTA Dad" shirt. Thank you Scott for all you do for GHS!
