days of making cards with school glue and construction paper are over. That was cute at 5, but now we're 35, etc., and that's not as cute at 35 years old. Today we purchase gifts depending on who the gift is for and the relationship with the person. And based on those things, we determine how much we will spend on the gift. There are some people in our lives that, regardless the cost of the gift, if we're able, it's a done deal. But there are others that we

put limits on. But the scriptures say "freely you have received, freely give". God did

not treat us in that fashion. Thank God! Because none were worthy of the priceless gift He gave to us. [Matthew 10:8] God freely blessed us while we were still in sin and did not have a relationship with him. We were not concerned with Him at all and He still gave us a priceless gift, His son Jesus. We should learn from the Master.

Now let's talk about the gifts God wants us to give, not the ones we can purchase with money but those requiring giving of ourselves. The gifts that cost us what really matters to us, us. Give some love, some forgiveness, obedience, time, especially when you don't feel like it or you don't think they deserve it. He did it for us!

soundness, and prosperity cost Jesus EVERYTHING. A price He was willing to pay; we meant that much to Him. (Praise God!!!) Can we say the same thing, the song says, 'withholding nothing'. Can we give until it hurts, or maybe a better question is: are we willing to give until it hurts? The next time God begins to deal with us let's think about the one who is receiving the gift and not about ourselves. What if Jesus had shown that attitude towards us because we didn't deserve anything He did for us? But instead he chose to see it as not being about himself, but about us. Is He worthy of the cost?

The scripture says, "to consider Jesus less we get weary and faint in our mind". [Hebrews 12:3] How much

are we willing to pay for God's anointing? Is it too expensive? Is it worthy, is it or worth it? Or do we tell God, you're asking a hard thing....." [2 Kings 2:10] Most things God asks of us is a hard thing to our flesh, until we totally surrender and say 'nevertheless'. Obedience to God is a challenge to our flesh, but we must deem Him worthy of the cost and the sacrifice.

Psalm 126:1-5 says, Those who sow in tears, will reap with shouts of joy. Tears do not last always, neither does pain. This too shall pass. When we have a problem giving, it exposes an ungodly way in us. And if we choose to not let God work it out of us, that area is going to continue to be a hindrance in our lives. Tears do not move God;

after we finish crying the task is still there for us to obey. God needs people He can flow through not only flow things to. Self-ishness and stinginess is not of God. Can we give when it hurts? Hurts our pride, our image, and our pocket? Do we love

our image more than pleasing God? Jesus did it for us. He looked real bad for us. He did not need us, we needed Him, but He did it anyway. We were in need of a savior, so He humbled himself and said prepare me a body that I may come in the volume of the book to do thy will oh Lord". [Hebrews 10:5-7] What will it take for us to count Him worthy of everything? If God asks us to forgive when you did not do anything, is He worth it? Freely received, freely give. He gave it to us can we not do the same?

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


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

taught this survival tool to his disciples, when he instructed them to shake the dust off their feet when the Gospel is not welcome. Why? It can become hazardous. It is our normal proclivity that unites all mankind, to rid ourselves of anything pointless, ineffective or hazardous to our existence.

But I want to challenge that way of thinking or train of thought and suggest to us that we should not be so quick to get rid of everything that we



challenge to us not to throw away our ashes. If we have lived for any amount of time, we have some things that resulted from the blazes of disappointment, the inferno of illness, or the heat of heartache. We all have our ashes, they are reminders of what did or did not happen. But even with all of that, I want to challenge us not to throw them away.

In this text, it is one that is distinguished because it is

filled with so many moving parts. One is Isaiah, who is the eagle-eyed prophet, who is writing here and takes time speaking on the behalf of God. God has arrested him to implement this message, but what is powerful about this message is we see God has employed individuals,

(mourners), to initiate his will concerning those who have been mistreated. We normally talk about this text from the perspective of the one that is anointed. Put it in the first person, of how we anointed. But today I want to approach the text, not from the anointed, but rather the one the anointed is talking to. I want to talk to the ones who are hurting, the ones who are broken, the ones who have been wounded, the ones who have been challenged, the ones who have been discouraged, and need the anointing. I want to tell you that God is mindful of you. The anointed one is speaking to us and he is announcing to us that change is coming. Change is happening right now!

This is a text of hope. Recovery is a text of restoration. The anointed one preaches good news that he binds the broken hearts, he proclaims freedom, and he helps those in prison get free. He pro-

claims the year of Jubilee, a year of profuse and lavish favor shall be bestowed upon you. What is wonderful about this text is there was a contrast in Isaiah 61:2. He says it is a day of favor and God's good pleasure, but it also is a day of vengeance. So for those who have been mourning and hurting God is getting ready to give us a year of favor, of replenishing and restitution. Therefore, ones who have been afflicting God's people, you are going to have to deal with God. The good thing here is, he said, I am proclaiming the year of the Lord, to proclaim means to call, to invite, to summon; which means anytime it is declared you don't have to wait until January 1st. You can declare it right now. That is what God did in Exodus for Moses. Prophetically when He said today is the first day of the year for the rest of your life. [Exodus 12:2]

God declares, I want to appoint to them in Zion, this means to set or ordain. Then he says I want to give, like an exchange program: beauty for ashes, the oil of joy for mourning, and the garment of praise for heaviness. But what we need to understand is many times when this text is preached, it is not about prosperity. It is more about a

state of being and mental health. It is more concerned with the believer's state of mind. Isaiah is focusing on what is left. The ashes are residue after the fire. Ashes are a sign something was here, ashes are a reminder of what used to be. The problem with ashes is we keep crying over that which was. We are ever reminded of what used to be. Ashes of employment, ashes of ministry, ashes of business, ashes of relationships. There is something I feel we must consider while we are sitting here crying over what used to be. Have you considered who started the fire? Since ashes are a result of a fire, who started the fire? What was the accelerant used? Some may say if God was the progenitor of this fire, he must be an arsonist. If he is the one that started this fire, the accelerant, he may have considered destiny, which is the time for you to be blessed. God's plan and time always equals manifestation. Many times God's purpose for us can not happen until we are willing to let go of what we already have.

Destiny is challenged because many of us get comfortable where we are, so God has to use, or better yet, allow the fire of life to get us to the

next place. Why does he use fire? Because if he tears it down, he knows we are going to rebuild it. If he just breaks it, we are going to put it back together again. If he destroys it, we are going to be in lack until we can resurrect it. God chose fire to make sure we could not go back to it anymore, to push us to the next place he is about to take us.

Fire Test

In the Old Testament, one of the most meaningful offerings was the burnt offering; ascending upward, as in going upward in smoke, symbolized total dedication of the offering unto God. This is to be completely consumed by fire so that it was available for nothing else. Everything was offered up to God! Look at David when it was time for him to be King, he was down in Ziklag. God desired to move David to the next place, but David was stuck in Ziklag. God allowed the Amalekites to burn Ziklag down to the ground. [1 Samuel 30:1] He made sure there was nothing left for him to deal with, so David would not have a choice but to move on to his destiny, the throne.

Again, in the Old Testament, the way people knew God favored and accepted who they were, came by fire that consumed their offering. Elijah called down fire on Mt. Carmel, and God sent down the fire to show his acceptance. There are those who are crying about the fire, but it is a sign that God's favor is on your life. If God allowed the fires of life to consume it, there is obviously something better for you ahead that God is trying to get you to.

Traditionally, when we look at the fire, we see it as being over, we see it as something being destroyed, and we see it as an end. I want to challenge you from the perspective of what the anointing does. The anointing by definition removes burdens and destroys yokes. [Isaiah 10:27] You've got to understand this. If you look at verse one in our text concerning the prisoners, in the original text it is not about opening up prison doors, but it is about opening up the eyes. It is a point of enlightenment in which he really is dealing with now. God is after changing your mind. So when you talk about being healed, healing is not about changing the condition, healing is about changing your mind, about how you see what you have been through. It's not about changing your situation first, it's about changing your mind about the situation. So we must get this understanding in order to move on to our destiny.

The Anointing says I am going to give you beauty for your ashes. Ashes were a sign of mourning, a sign of repentance. In biblical time they would wrap their head with ashes when they were mourning. The writer here says, I am getting ready to give you, by the power of the anointing, beauty. Beauty here is a diadem or a crown as a head dress, its' glory. What the writer says is God is going to take away your ashes and he is going to give you a new head dress. Literally, this is what God is about to do; God is about to change your mind; change your perspective; how you see things. Yes, it is burnt to the ground, but God is about to change your mind. [Isaiah 28:5]

While you look at the ashes, it is your natural inclination to want to discard them, but if you get rid of them, you lose your power of exchange. In Greek mythology there is a bird called the Phoenix. The power of the Phoenix is though it is destroyed by fire, its uniqueness is it rises out of the ashes. The enemy wants you to go and die and get rid



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of the ashes and mourn. But God is about to give you a crown of beauty for your ashes. Like Maya Angelou said, still I rise.

Even when Jesus died, they thought it was over. But early Sunday morning, he rose

with all power. God gave Jesus beauty for His ashes. Take the memories of what was and give them to God and receive what God is giving you. He is anointing your mind to receive what He has already done. No matter what went down, God is about to raise it up in his

glory! There is a Blessing, After the Fire.

Silent Harps Psalm 137:1-4

Summary


137 By the rivers of Babylon, there we sat down, yea, we wept, when we remembered Zion. ² We hanged our harps upon the willows in the midst thereof. ³ For there they that carried us away captive required of us a song; and they that wasted us required of us mirth, saying, Sing us one of the songs of Zion. ⁴ How shall we sing the LORD's song in a strange land?

The author of Psalm 137 is unknown and possibly written after their return from captivity. The first four verses reminisce the day of exile, the distress of captivity, the location, the water. We have a sense of sorrow as the writer describes how they wept as they were taken

- I. The Reason for Silent Harps The people were:
 - A. Out of place [v1A] -Out of their home land -Out of church
 - B. Out of position [v1b] -They sat down -They Quit
 - C. Out of practice [v1c] -They forgot God
 - D. Out of plans [v4] -No plans to serve God
- II. Results of Silent Harps –The people lost their desire to:
 - A. War against sin
 - 1. Compromised their witness
 - 2. Conformed to the world
 - B. Be servants
 - 1. To walk in faithfulness
 - 2. To go with fervency half hearted

 - E. Remember the Church Christ died for it

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
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
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
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
