Senior-Sensitive Building Standards for All Homes:

The 2014 Provincial Policy Statements, governing all land use planning decisions in Ontario, contains a new Implementation policy 4.6 "This Provincial Policy Statement shall be implemented in a manner that is consistent with the Ontario Human Rights Code and the Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms."

This justifies the Town of Caledon to amend its Building By-laws and Official Plan to incorporate accessible and adaptable housing for aging-inplace.

Basic requirements must include changes to all new housing such as grade level main floors, three foot wide entrance doors, a room on the ground floor changeable from a den to a bedroom, interior doors on the main floor wide enough for wheel chairs, walls in bathrooms strong enough for securing grab bars, etc.

These provisions would be good for anyone now, good for future seniors and increase the sales value of houses.




