







8% Increase in breeding population since 2013 through nest boxes (184). A positive example for the rest of the country









Glens of Antrim Swift Box Project

It is estimated that Swift numbers have fallen by up to 50% in the last 25 years. One of the main causes for this decline is a lack of nesting sites that would have been found in old buildings. 


TOTAL NO OF VISITS JUNE 24th 2011
