hen the Carolina Golf Journal printed its first issue in 2009, there was another golf beginning in July of that same year, and both golf community "rookies" have hopefully given local golfers a great deal of enjoyment.

Red Bridge Golf Club in Locust, NC, located 10 miles east of I-485 on Highway 24/27, is the center-piece of a projected 1,600-home development called the Villages at Red Bridge. The housing construction has been slow going, but the golf course as far surpassed its early billing as one of the area's top courses.

Designed by former Pete Dye protégé David Postlethwaite, the just

under 6,800-yard layout has no holes that run parallel, creating plenty of open space. With most of the greens open in the front, the course is not cluttered with bunkers and the ones that do come into play are not hugging the greens giving golfers a variety of lay-up or go-for-it opportunities on their approach shots.

Being fully sodded at the beginning, the fairways run through distinct topographical changes. Water holes are created by a natural stream that winds throughout the course featuring

unexpected landscape and hardscape elements, and 18 exquisite holes that end with well-conditioned MiniVerde greens.

"Golfers have told us they appreciate the value they get with the quality of the golf course," stated General Manager and Head PGA Professional Mark Davis.

"Another factor they have enjoyed is that our drainage may be the best of any course in the area, which allows quicker play after heavy rains."

Red Bridge, in the foothills of the Uwharrie Mountains, plays to a par-72 with 5-sets of tees - Black tees reaching 6,735 yards; White tees 6,402; Gold tees 5,768; Red/Ladies tees 4,913. The course is a little unusual with 5 par-5's, 5 par3's and 8 par4's.

The **RED BRIDGE VIP CARD** can be purchased for \$75 and the golfer receives the following:


- A round of golf on day of purchase

EIGHT RULES FOR PRACTICING DELIBERATELY

lbert Einstein once said the following about the learning process: "One must develop an instinct for what one can just barely achieve through one's greatest efforts". I like to refer to this place as the Sweet Spot. This is the place, right on the edge of your ability, where you learn best and fastest.

When trying to learn something new, in this case trying to improve your golf game, you need to try to get out of your comfort zone. The comfort zone is a place that is easy and effortless. You may be working, but not reaching or struggling.

The sweet spot is where you may experience frustration, difficulty, and alertness to errors. You're finally engaged in an intense struggle.

This is more commonly known as Deliberate Practice. When attempting to practice deliberately, you must follow these rules to gain the absolute most from your efforts.



RULES FOR DELIBERATE PRACTICE:

1. *Take a little bit at a time.* This advice works because it accurately reflects the way our brains learn.

Every skill is built out of smaller pieces - what scientists call chunks. No matter what skill you set out to learn, the pattern is always the same: See the whole thing - break it down to its simplest elements - put it back together. Repeat.

2. Each day, try to build one perfect chunk. "Don't look for the big, quick improvement. Seek the small improvement one day at a time.



That's the only way it happens – and when it happens, it lasts." – John Wooden

Choose five minutes a day over an hour a week. With deep practice, small 3. daily "snacks" are more effective than once a week practice bingers. The act of practicing making time to do it, doing it well – can be thought of as a skill in itself, perhaps the most important skill of all.

4. Embrace struggle. Most people instinctively avoid struggle, because it's uncomfortable. It feels like failure. However, when it comes to developing your talent, struggle isn't an option – it's a biological necessity. Your brain works just like your muscles - "no pain, no gain."

5. **Pay immediate attention to your mistakes.** People who pay deeper attention to an error learn significantly more than those who ignore it. Mistakes are merely tools for building skill.

Slow it down. It's not how fast you can do it. It's how slowly you can do it correct-6. ly. Ben Hogan used to practice so slowly that when he finally contacted the ball, it moved about an inch. The urge for speed makes sense, but creates sloppiness. Don't trade precision and long-term performance for a temporary thrill.

7. To learn a new move, exaggerate it. Going too far helps us understand where the boundaries are. Feel the outer edges of the move, and then work on building the skill with precision.

8. Don't do drills, play small addictive games. Drills can be the most mundane of activities, but they can be turned into a game. If it can be counted, it can be a game. Track your progress, and see how many points you score over a week. The following week, try to score more.

WELLS FARGO CHAMPIONSHIP 17th year for premier sports event in Charlotte

ach spring PGA TOUR stars, a national and international television audience, and thousands of fans from the entire Charlotte region enjoy the Wells Fargo Championship April 29-May 5 at Quail Hollow Club in Charlotte, NC.

For the past 16 years, this highly respected and recognized golf tournament has been the stage for great performances by the game's best players. The tournament also provides the opportunity to raise awareness and funds for charitable causes. The goal is to be an energetic partner for the community.

While the tournament is held annually at Quail Hollow Club, it was staged at Eagle Point Golf Club in Wilmington, NC in 2017. Quail Hollow Club hosted the PGA Championship in August of that year.

With support from the title sponsor Wells Fargo, numerous corporate partners, fans, and 2,300 volunteers, Champions for Education, a non-profit organization created in 2002 as the charitable arm for the tournament, has donated over \$22 million to various charitable organizations within the communities of both Charlotte and Wilmington. Including: Teach for America Charlotte (\$12.9 million), Levine Children's Hospital (\$776.000) and The First Tee Greater Charlotte (\$700,000).

Also, each time the tournament is held, it is broadcast on average 15 hours to a television audience that reaches over 580 million households and more than 225 countries. It is also estimated that the economic impact on the area is between \$40



and \$60 million annually.

When David Toms was crowned the Wells Fargo Championship's first winner on a beautiful spring Sunday afternoon in 2003, tournament officials and sports fans realized this event, indeed, would be special.

As a result of bringing all of the pieces together and seeking ways to improve each spring, the Wells Fargo Championship quickly rose to the top echelon of PGA TOUR events.



One of the barometers is the caliber of players competing in the tournament. Of the 16 winners, half are major champions, including Toms, Vijay Singh, Jim Furyk, Tiger Woods, two-time champion Rory McIlroy, Lucas Glover and Jason Day. 54-hole leader Jason Day won the 2018 Wells Fargo Championship by two strokes over 21-year-old Aaron Wise and five-time PGA TOUR winner Nick Watney.

Young up-and-coming stars of golf have found glory winning the Wells Fargo Championship. For McIlroy, Rickie Fowler, Anthony Kim and Derek Ernst, lifting the trophy marked their first win on the PGA TOUR. Sean O'Hair, J.B. Holmes, James Hahn, and Brian Harman found redemption and a career boost thanks to their victories. Each has reflected that given the course, the strong field of competitors and the overall atmosphere the win is considered a top achievement in their careers.

The excitement of the competition has traditionally been exceptional. Seven times a playoff has been necessary to decide a champion, including two separate stretches of three consecutive years in 2004-2006 and again in 2011-2013.

In 2009 and 2010, the tournament received "Best in Class" among PGA TOUR events.

Who founded Augusta National, and who designed it? Augusta National was founded by Bobby Jones and Clifford Roberts. The course was designed by Alister MacKenzie.


When was the first Masters played and who won?

The first Masters was played in 1934, and Horton Smith won by two strokes with a score of four-under-par 284.

Does the Masters winner get a new green jacket if they have won before? No, a player that wins the Masters

multiple times

receives the same



green jacket from his initial win, unless he needs to be refitted.

Who has won the most Masters?

Jack Nicklaus has won the most Masters, with six, his last coming in 1986 at the age of 46. He remains the oldest player to ever win the Masters.



Has any player ever won back-to-back Masters?

Yes, three players have defended their title at the Masters -Jack Nicklaus (1965-1966), Nick Faldo (1989-1990) and Tiger Woods (2001-2002).

Who won the 2018 Masters?

Patrick Reed won the 2018 Masters for his first major title, edging Rickie Fowler by one stroke and Jordan Spieth by two after the three-time major winner made furious charge, carding a final-round 64.

What is the scoring record at the Masters?

Tiger Woods and Jordan Spieth share the lowest 72-hole score in Masters history, which is 18-under (270). Woods in 1997, and Spieth in 2015.

What's the closest an amateur has ever come to winning the Masters?

Three players have finished runner-up at the Masters: Frank Stranahan (1947), Ken Venturi (1956) and Charles Coe (1961).

What is Amen Corner?

Amen Corner is the name for a three-hole stretch of the course beginning with the par-4 11th hole, then goes to the par-3 12th and par-5 13th. The term was coined by author Herbert Warren Wind when he used it in a 1958 Sports Illustrated article, specifically referring to the

approach shot on the 11th, the entire 12th hole and the first two shots on the 13th. This "corner" of the golf course is where some of the tournament's most historic moments have taken place.



Who can play at Augusta National?

Augusta National is a private club only open to members and their guests.

What is the broadcast schedule for the Masters?

The first and second round coverage of the Masters is broadcast live on ESPN, beginning at 3 p.m. EST on Thursday and Friday. On Saturday, live coverage is on CBS beginning at 3 p.m. and on Sunday beginning at



2 p.m. The Par-3 Contest is also on ESPN on Wednesday at 3 p.m.







Improvements add to beauty and value



Following the completion of the course designed by Bruce


Brodsky in 2008, Edgewater Golf Club took on a personality all its own. Tumbling across rolling hills covered with a blanket of matures trees, the terrain is as scenic as it is challenging, providing the layout with dramatic elevation changes and plenty of water including the beautiful Fishing Creek Lake.

In addition to the natural hazards, there are numerous strategically placed bunkers lurking along the greensides. Under the direction of Superintendent Will Ford, the 35 bunkers have already been completely rebuilt to provide great playing conditions, even when your ball goes where it shouldn't. He has also undertaken a project to open up views of the lake on #7, #13, and the driving range by selectively removing several trees.

Edgewater was voted one of the toughest courses from the back tees in the Charlotte area by the Charlotte Business Journal. The par-3 #4 hole features an island tee and asks players to hit a 230-yard, uphill shot over water to a green protected by a steep front. The longest hole on the course is # 5, a par-5 that plays to 570 yards. The shortest hole at Edgewater is # 8, a par-3 that plays to 173 yards from the back tees.

If you want something less than the back tees, Edgewater offers that as well. The course has five sets of tee stations. The greens are big and gently contoured, not overdone. Par for the course is 72. From the back tees the course plays to 7,103 yards. From the forward tees the course plays to 4,717 yards. Play forward and enjoy your round.

That enjoyment starts with your arrival. The Edgewater staff will make a great first impression by meeting you at the parking lot with your cart, verify your tee time, and offer directions to the pro shop and driving range.

The golf world loses legendary sports writer and friend


man that thousands of aspiring sports writers looked up to passed away in early March following a lengthy illness. Dan Jenkins, the legendary Sports Illustrated golf writer and best-selling novelist died at the age of 89.

Jenkins began his career with for the Fort Worth Press and the Dallas Times Herald before joining Sports Illustrated, where he spent over 25 years, most notably writing about golf and college football. Jenkins eventually left SI for Golf Digest. His career spanned more than six decades.

I first met Jenkins while covering the 1968 Colonial Open in Fort Worth as the sports director of a television station in Lubbock, TX. It was my rookie year of attending PGA golf tournaments, and I was happy to receive any advice I could get to help my daily reports sound more professional.



Jenkins, a Fort Worth, Texas native attended Texas Christian University, where he was a member of the golf team. As a former Texas Tech Red Raider, I talked to Jenkins about the old Southwest Conference sports before he offered me very helpful advice on how to cover a PGA event.



After the second round of the Colonial, Jenkins called me over in the press room and asked if I would like to join him for "something special" in the interview room. I quickly accepted his invitation. There were only nine people in the room when we entered, but three were the reason this was indeed special.

Sitting in three lounge chairs around the fireplace were Byron Nelson, Arnold Palmer and Ben Hogan. For more than two hours the three legends of golf shared stories and anticdotes of their careers and life on the tour. Needless to say, it was one of the biggest thrills of my broadcast and writing career, and all made possible by the kindness of Dan Jenkins.

The Hall of Fame writer won countless awards, including the Lifetime Achievement Award in Sports Journalism from the PGA of America, and is one of only three writers to have been inducted into the World Golf Hall of Fame.

Despite all his honors, I will remember Dan Jenkins more for being one of the really nice guys that wasn't too high and mighty to welcome one of those thousands of aspiring young sports writers to his world of true and honest journalism.
